Judah's Dilemma = I _____ the Creator

Jeremiah 25:3-4 "For twenty-three years, from the thirteenth year of Josiah the son of Amon, king of Judah, to this day, the word of the LORD has come to me, and I have spoken persistently to you, but you have not listened. [4] You have neither listened nor inclined your ears to hear, although the LORD persistently sent to you all his servants the prophets"

Judah's Distress = Angering the Creator

Jeremiah 25:7 "Yet you have not listened to me, declares the LORD, that you might provoke me to anger with the work of your hands to your own harm."

Judah's Disaster = P _____ by the Creator

Jeremiah 25:29 "For behold, I begin to work disaster at the city that is called by my name, and shall you go unpunished? You shall not go unpunished, for I am summoning a sword against all the inhabitants of the earth, declares the LORD of hosts."

Judah's Opportunity = Another Chance

Jeremiah 26:2-3 "Thus says the LORD: Stand in the court of the LORD's house, and speak to all the cities of Judah that come to worship in the house of the LORD all the words that I command you to speak to them; do not hold back a word. [3] It may be they will listen, and every one turn from his evil way, that I may relent of the disaster that I intend to do to them because of their evil deeds."

Jeremiah's Dilemma: F _____ in the Face of Death Jeremiah 26:12-15 "Then Jeremiah spoke to all the officials and all the people, saying, "The LORD sent me to prophesy against this house and this city all the words you have heard...[15] Only know for certain that if you put me to death, you will bring innocent blood upon yourselves and upon this city and its inhabitants, for in truth the LORD sent me to you to speak all these words in your ears."

Jeremiah's Deliverance: God Cares

Jeremiah 26:24 "But the hand of Ahikam the son of Shaphan was with Jeremiah so that he was not given over to the people to be put to death."

God Showed Jeremiah Two Types of People

Jeremiah 24:3 "And the LORD said to me, 'What do you see, Jeremiah?' I said, 'Figs, the good figs very good, and the bad figs very bad, so bad that they cannot be eaten.'"

Good Fruit = Eternal S _____

Jeremiah 24:4-7 "Then the word of the LORD came to me: [5] 'Thus says the LORD, the God of Israel: Like these good figs, so I will regard as good the exiles from Judah, whom I have sent away from this place to the land of the Chaldeans. [6] I will set my eyes on them for good, and I will bring them back to this land. I will build them up, and not tear them down; I will plant them, and not pluck them up. [7] I will give them a heart to know that I am the LORD, and they shall be my people and I will be their God, *for they shall return to me with their whole heart.*'"

Bad Fruit = Eternal D _____
